Arajilla Retreat Lord Howe Island Offers a Three Night World Heritage Discovery

A scenic walk to Little Island with 'Ramblin Ronnie'.
View the southern end of the island, Mt Lidgbird & Mt Gower, where the world's most southern coral reef ends and rare wood hens are often seen and can be hand fed.

Three nights accommodation at Arajilla Retreat in a Kentia or Banyan Suite – with optional easy add-on nights.

All meals – gourmet breakfasts, light lunches, selected pre-dinner drinks each evening, three course dinners with menu changing daily, coffee & tea.
